This book captures the American home front experience through a Wisconsin lens: the political debates over war policy, the worry over loved ones fighting overseas, the countless everyday sacrifices, and the impact of a wartime hysteria that drove dissent underground. The book

also includes letters and accounts from soldiers fighting the war from Wisconsin's famed 32nd Division. Copies of the book will be available for purchase courtesy of Wisconsin Historical Society Press, and the evening will conclude with a book signing.
