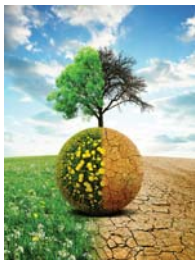

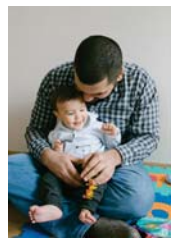
TINY TOTS STORYTIME

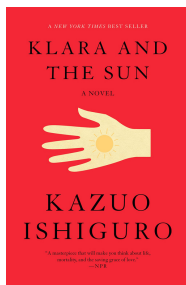
